

Amy A. Eyler, Ph.D.

Dr. Amy A. Eyler is a professor of public health and the deputy director of the Prevention Research Center at the Brown School at Washington University in St. Louis (WashU). The focus of her research is how policies and the built environment impact chronic disease prevention, mainly through behaviors such as physical activity and healthy eating. She is also co-director of the Nature and Health Alliance at WashU. She is the author of over 100 peer-reviewed publications and three books, including one of the first textbooks on research methods for public health. In addition to her research, Dr. Eyler is an advocate for gender equity at Washington University. She is a past president of the Association for Women Faculty and served as a Gender Equity Faculty Fellow in the Office of the Provost for six years. She is past chair of the Faculty Senate Council and Chair of the Danforth Campus Conflict of Interest in Research Committee. Dr. Eyler has a bachelor's degree in community health, a master's degree in physical education from Ohio University, and a doctorate in public health from Oregon State University. She also serves on the Executive Board of Girls on the Run St. Louis and volunteers throughout her community.
